

HOME-SCHOOL AGREEMENT

A home-school agreement is a statement explaining:

- the school's aims and values;
- the school's responsibilities towards its students;
- the responsibility of each student's parents or carers; and
- what the school expects of its students.

Vision Statement

We will empower our children to become respected citizens to enable them to make valuable contributions locally, globally and to contribute to our world's sustainable future.

This can be done most effectively when all staff, parents and children understand their responsibilities and work together towards the same goals, as detailed in our home-school agreement.

Requirements

The school's Senior Management and Advisory Board must take reasonable steps to ensure that all registered parents/carers of students of compulsory school age sign the parental declaration to indicate that they understand and accept the contents of the agreement.

Schools should take reasonable steps to ensure that all 'parents' both within and outside the child's home, giving equal weight to both mothers and fathers, are given the opportunity to indicate that they understand and accept the contents of the home-school agreement, and review the content of the agreement regularly during the time their child is at school. Where parents/carers have separated it is important that, where possible, both mothers and fathers are given the opportunity to sign a copy of the agreement's parental declaration.

- arrive on time each day. Tutor time starts at 08:45; lessons start at 09:15
- attend all lessons punctually
- come prepared for lessons with books and all necessary equipment
- follow all the school's policies including the Academic Honesty policy and the Positive Behaviour policy
- hand my mobile phone in to the Office when I arrive at school
- dress appropriately in line with the school dress code
- be friendly, co-operative and thoughtful
- focus on working hard and making progress
- be involved fully in activities
- always try to do my best
- always complete and hand in prepwork on time

Parents' Responsibilities

We acknowledge that in order for our child to complete the IB Middle Years Programme and attain a full certificate they should:

- attend the school on a full-time basis from Year 4
- achieve a grade 3 or above in all eight subject areas
- complete a personal project in Year 5 that meets the IB MYP criteria and achieves grade 3 or above
- meet the school's requirement for Community Service.

We also acknowledge that we, as parents/carers, are the primary educators of our children and have an irreplaceable role to play in supporting our children's learning at school.

Therefore I/ we agree to:

- work with the school in supporting the education of my child
- ensure that my child attends school regularly and maintains an attendance record of above 90%
- ensure that my child arrives at school on time and suitably equipped (see equipment list in Appendix A)
- support the vision and values of the school community



Parents' Responsibilities (continued)

- encourage my child to be enthusiastic about learning, provide opportunities for home learning and support the completion of prepwork
- enable my child to take part in school events, activities and/or trips and to pay for any associated additional costs
- work in co-operation with staff to resolve issues and problems that may arise and let the school know of any issues that might affect my child's work, behaviour or attendance
- support the school's policies and procedures including the academic honesty agreement, mentoring programme, dress code and positive behaviour policy, which are intended to promote the highest standards of behaviour and discipline.
- ensure that my child has a healthy school/home routine with limited gaming/ phone/ online activity and sufficient sleep and nutrition.
- support my child to only bring in healthy snacks (no chewing gum, sweets or sugary drinks)
- encourage my child to show kindness and consideration to others and to always behave appropriately
- participate in whatever way possible in school events
- treat staff and students with courtesy and good manners.
